

INTERNATIONAL TRAINING COURSE ON RESILIENT FINANCING FOR SETTLEMENT PLANNING (I-ReFine)

Course Design

The international course is an attempt to highlight the financial options that play a role in the planning of resilient settlements. The objectives of this course include but not limited to the following:

- 1. Understanding the concept of resilient financing for programs, projects, and activities (PAPs) relevant to settlement planning.*
- 2. Discussing the scope and determinants of resilient financing in settlement planning.*
- 3. Learning the best Practices of resilient financing, in the context of risk resilient settlement planning and implementation.*

At the end of the course, the participants are expected to be able to comprehensively discuss

- *The options for making financial mechanism for resilient settlement planning available for consideration.*
- *Incorporating the components of resilient financing in community-based settlement planning.*
- *The roles of stakeholders in the financing process and implementation.*
- *Sharing of good practices of the resilient financing component in settlement planning and implementation in the Asia-Pacific context.*

Target Participants

The target participants for the training course include the planning officers and staff from the relevant national government agencies and their bureaus in the Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam. Furthermore, this course is also open to officials from a) Local Government Units; c) Housing Development Professionals and Practitioners; d) Researchers and Specialists e) NGO and CSO Representatives; f) Community Leaders; g) Academia and h) Other stakeholders directly and indirectly involved in resilient financing.

Course Duration: 2 weeks (August 27- September 5, 2024)

Course Delivery Methodologies

The course comprises of four (4) synchronous sessions,

- Three (3) sessions with lecture modules.
 - The first two sessions will include two (2) lectures in each session
 - The third session will feature case studies from Asia-Pacific region and briefing on how to develop the group output with the case studies.
- The final session will include presentations of case studies as output of group-work activity.

The participants are expected to attend all synchronous sessions and actively contribute to the group activity.

At the end of modules, a knowledge check test will be accomplished the participants followed by post-training evaluation at the end of the course.

Certification

- *Completion of the training course is equivalent to **10 technical training hours**.*
- *Certificate of completion will be issued to participants **with passing status and 70% attendance** in the synchronous sessions.*
- *Accomplishment of knowledge check and post-training evaluation is required to obtain completion certificate.*
